

Monday	06/07/2020	Fredericia – a historical walk + Bridgewalking Fredericia is an old fortress city and has a unique military history. Later we go "Bridgewalking" on the old Lillebælt Bridge – one of the few places in the world, where this can be done. Evening: Planning Wednesday night's cooking
Tuesday	07/07/2020	Canoeing on "Gudenåen" – longest river in Denmark
